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Quiz 1

We are concerned -

- A family is concerned regarding their son's behaviour. He has been isolated in his room for a week and refusing to eat. He accuses his family of trying to poison his food and sending him rays through the walls to keep him from sleeping.
- What options do the family has to have their son assessed?

Quiz 1 (continued)

1. The family can bring their son to the GP for assessment
2. The family can bring their son to an ER for assessment
3. The GP can go the family's home to see/assess the son

What if the son refuses to go?

Quiz 1 (continued)

- If the son refuses to go to ER or to see the GP then:
 1. The GP can issue a Form 1 (if the GP has seen the son in the last 7 days)
 2. The family can go to the Justice of Peace who can issue a Form 2
 3. The family can request the police to come to their home and see their son. The police have the discretion to bring the son to ER

Criteria and More

- What are the 3 criteria used to fill our a From 1 and give an example of each criterion?

Quiz 2 (continued)

1. **past or present threat or attempt to cause bodily harm to self or others**

Ex: suicidal ideation, suicide attempt, self-harm, violent or homicidal ideation

2. **past or present violent behaviour or causing another to fear bodily harm**

Ex: assaulting, intimidating, threatening others

3. **past or present lack of competence to care for self**

Ex: not adhering with medical treatment with risk of serious medical complications, intimidating behaviours with risk of being assaulted by others, engaging in risky sexual behaviours, setting fires at home

Detaining a patient in a hospital?

- You were asked to see John- an 80 yo male of NFA who was admitted yesterday for cellulitis. He refuses iv antibiotics and wants to leave because “I feel OK”. There is no evidence of psychosis, suicidal or homicidal ideation. Under what act can you detain John in the hospital?

Quiz 3 (continued)

John can be detained in the hospital under the **Health Care Consent Act**

There is no evidence from the history suggestive of any the criteria used under the Mental Health Act. John does not appear to have a mental illness and he does not appear to be suicidal, homicidal or unable to take care of self due to a mental illness.
